

# **Categories (Sorting and Organizing)**

## **Purpose**

This routine encourages students to express ideas without the pressure of finding a correct answer. It also allows students to practice categorizing, labeling, and thinking creatively. This routine is adapted from the Professional Learning Opportunities Project's English Language Proficiency Standards (ELPS) course.

#### **Time**

This routine takes 5-10 minutes.

# **Supported standards**

ELPS 4: Construct level-appropriate oral and written claims and support them with reasoning and evidence.

#### **Materials**

- Flashcards with words or pictures
- Blank table/chart (optional)

#### **Procedure**

- 1. The instructor creates flashcards with a word or picture on each. (Note: instructors may want to include older vocabulary that the student is familiar with but hasn't practiced recently.)
- 2. The instructor gives the student(s) the collection of flashcards and explains that they need to sort the flashcards into categories of their own making. Student(s) can use the premade chart provided on the last page of this document or they can group the flashcards in another way that makes sense. The instructor can model the activity first to demonstrate sorting the cards into categories.
- Students explain how they organized the words or pictures. Students can add headings to their charts and explain their rationale for each group orally or in writing.
- 4. This routine can be done in a group with initial discussion between students, or it can be done one-on-one with a student directly explaining their reasoning and opinion to the instructor. In an online environment, the instructor can provide the list of words or pictures in a shareable document or whiteboard, and students can copy/paste or move the items into different columns on the chart.
